A Very Brief History of NYK

In the 1890's immigrants from Japan began arriving in the U.S. to seek a better life for themselves and their families. Those who shared the same dialect and came from the same hometown or village usually stayed close to each other.

In 1905 a group of Yamaguchi-Ken men, led by its first president, Kakichi Waki, met in Little Tokyo and formed the Yamaguchi Kenjinkai with the purpose of helping to support each other in times of illness and misfortune. New arrivals from Yamaguchi were provided assistance in settling in their new environment.

Due to World War II and the incarceration of Japanese Americans, the Kenjinkai activities were halted and did not resume until 1946 under the leadership of Waichi Yoshimura.

In 2005 the Nanka Yamaguchi Kenjinkai celebrated its 100th Anniversary. There are a few commemorative program books from the 100th Anniversary and if you are interested in obtaining a free copy, please let us know.

What is Yamaguchi Kenjinkai?

Ken or prefecture (province) represents a state such as California. Japan has 47 kens (or states). *Jin* means people and *kai* is an organization. Therefore, *Kenjinkai* means an *organization* whose members are from the same *Ken* (State) in Japan. It is a friendship and support group for members to help each other in times of need.

Meet Arturo Yoshimoto, our current NYK President.



Where were you born? I was born in Lima, Peru of Nisei parents, Victor Yoshimoto and Elena Endo. My paternal grandfather came to Peru from Iwakuni, Yamaguchi and my mother's family came to Peru from Shizuoka.

Where were you raised and where were you educated?

I was born and raised in Lima, Peru. I attended Santa Rita de Casia Catholic School in Lima. At 22, I came to the United States to finish my Mechanical Engineering degree at the California State University Northridge. I now enjoy a career as a Real Estate broker.



Where was your family during World War II? My family was in Peru working on a farm during WWII. We were not taken as POWs and were very fortunate to not be affected by the war.
